**Override Procedure (Profiled Stations Only):**

1. A medication order must be obtained by the patient's health care provider before an override transaction is initiated.
2. Medications are assigned an override status in Pyxis. A user's privileges to remove a specific medication on override are determined by that nurse's level of access, see list below.
  - a. Basic: Most nurses with med removal privileges can access these medications on override.
  - b. Obstetrics: Nurses assigned this access may remove all meds on the Basic list as well as those on the Obstetrics list.
  - c. Intensive: Nurses qualified to work in ICU/ER/Perioperative Area can access these medications, as well as any on the Basic and Obstetrics list.
3. The appropriate clinical manager will be notified if an override medication is taken without an order or if an override transaction does not fit the override medication criteria.  
Nurses are cautioned to use extreme care in deciding to use an override medication. THE PRESENCE OF A DRUG ON THE APPROVED OVERRIDE LIST DOES NOT MEAN THAT IT IS APPROPRIATE TO REMOVE BY OVERRIDE IN ALL SITUATIONS. The Override Medication process is to be used only in urgent situations when a delay in doing so would harm the patient. Nurses, when using the Override Medication process, must check drug-drug interactions; therapeutic duplication, drug indication, and allergies have been assessed for the medication in question.
4. Pharmacy will review all overrides to assure appropriateness of the override. The manager of pharmacy maintains the medication override list.
