FAMILY/FRIENDS

- **YCTA Paratransit Service** – For persons with a disability that cannot ride a bus. Available only in McMinnville and Newberg. 1 day advance notice required. For eligibility and application information call: **503-474-4900**



Medicaid / Oregon Health Plan Recipients

Transportation to and from medical appointments is available for those with Medicaid / Oregon Health Plan insurance.

2. Schedule transportation within 48 hours of an appointment.
