

Patients Served

A cerebrovascular accident (commonly called a stroke) can happen to anyone at any age. In 2023, St. Luke's provided inpatient rehabilitation services to more than **471 stroke survivors** with an average length of stay of **13.8 days** in the hospital. At Providence St. Luke's, stroke rehabilitation services are provided by an experienced team of physicians, nurses, case managers, psychologists and therapies including: physical, occupational, recreational, and speech therapy. Our patients receive at least **3 hours** of therapy per day 5 days a week.

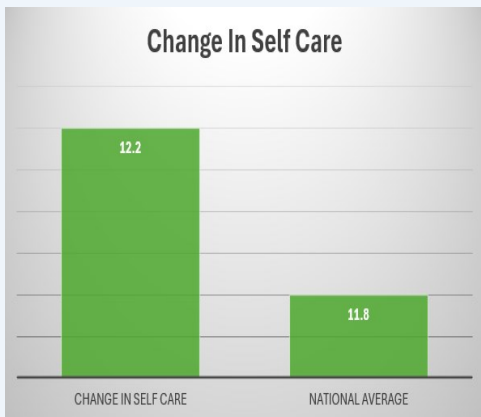

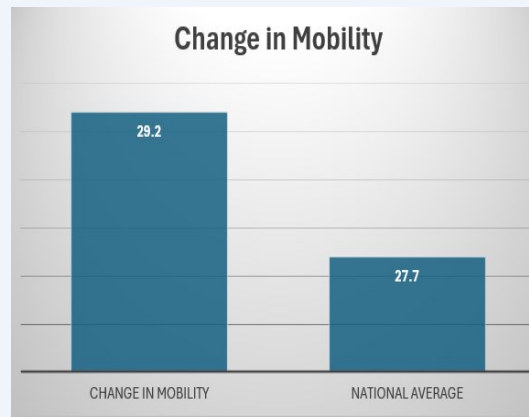
